Dr. Albano is Chief Medical Officer - Population Health Management at InVio Health Network and the Quality Officer/Chair - Primary Care Clinical Council at Prisma Health in Greenville, SC. He is an Advisory Board Member for Upfront Healthcare, Consultant for Guidepoint, and Consultant, RPM/CCM, for HealthSnap. Dr. Albano is Board-Certified in Family Medicine with a Certificate of Additional Qualification (CAQ) in Sports Medicine.

He is the first fellowship trained DO Neurointensivist and the first DO to be designated Fellow of Neurocritical Care Society. He received a Presidential Citation in 2014, 2017 and 2018, and 2020 from the Neurocritical Care Society and in 2017 from the Society of Critical Care Medicine.

Dr. Hakimi is the Director of Neuro ICU and Transcranial Doppler Ultrasound Services and the Chair of Pharmacy and Therapeutics at Prisma Health-Upstate in Greenville, SC. He serves as a Professor at the University of South Carolina-Greenville School of Medicine.

Dr. Hakimi wrote the post-cardiac arrest hypothermia protocols for Durham County EMS (North Carolina) and later worked with the Oklahoma Office of the Medical Control Board to co-author the state's post-cardiac arrest treatment protocol, which was applied throughout the state. He served as the Vice Chair of the LifeShare Advisory Board (Oklahoma Organ Transplantation Services) from 2010-2013. He co-authored the Continuum article on the "Neuroimaging of Hemorrhagic Stroke."

He has a Master of Science in Radiological Health from the University of Michigan-Rackham Graduate School and is a graduate of Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine. He has 25 years of experience practicing as a Rural Surgeon, mostly in Ruidoso, NM, where he was often the only general surgeon available in an 80-mile radius. The New Mexico Governor appointed Dr. Lindsey as Chairman of the New Mexico Osteopathic Board of Medical Examiners where he served for eight years. President Bush appointed him as Commissioner of the United States/ Mexico Border Health Commission from 2003 to 2010.




