## MEET THE SPEAKERS

### **Andrew W. Albano, Jr., DO, MBA, CAQSM, CPE, FAAFP**

Dr. Albano is Chief Medical Officer - Population Health Management at InVio Health Network and the Quality Officer/Chair – Primary Care Clinical Council at Prisma Health in Greenville, SC. He is an Advisory Board Member for Upfront Healthcare, Consultant for Guidepoint, and Consultant, RPM/CCM, for HealthSnap. Dr. Albano is Board-Certified in Family Medicine with a Certificate of Additional Qualification (CAQ) in Sports Medicine.

He previously served as Vice Chairman of Quality and Medical Staff Affairs for Prisma Health Department of Family Medicine - Upstate. He is an Associate Professor at University of South Carolina School of Medicine and has a Master's Degree of Business Administration from Auburn University.

A graduate of New York College of Osteopathic Medicine, he completed a one-year rotating internship at Southampton Hospital on Long Island and a Family Medicine Residency at University of South Florida, where he was Chief Resident. Dr. Albano also completed a Primary Care Sports Medicine Fellowship at Thomas Jefferson University.

### **Pamela Bailey, DO, MPH**

Dr. Bailey is a Board-Certified Infectious Diseases Specialist at Prisma Health in Columbia, SC where she leads statewide initiatives around antimicrobial stewardship and infection prevention. She serves as Program Director for the South Carolina Regional Infection Prevention Training (SCRIPT) Center, Assistant Professor of Medicine at University of South Carolina School of Medicine, and Adjunct Faculty at University of South Carolina College of Pharmacy.

A graduate of West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine, Dr. Bailey completed an Internal Medicine Residency at Christiana Care Health System in Newark, DE and an Infectious Diseases Fellowship at Virginia Commonwealth University Health System. She completed an additional fellowship at VCU in hospital epidemiology and infection control and obtained her master's degree in public health (MPH). Her interests are in antibiotic stewardship and epidemiology, and her research interests include hand hygiene, personal protective equipment, and quality improvement.

### **Tatianna G. Briscoe, CPT**

Captain Briscoe is Officer in Charge (OIC) for the U.S. Army Medical Recruiting Station in Columbia, SC. The Columbia Battalion recruits, with integrity, high-quality men and women to meet Army requirements, in defense of the nation, while caring for all members of the command.

Dr. Buelt co-authored guidelines on Dyslipidemia, Headaches, COPD, low back pain, and depression for the Veteran Affairs and Department of Defense. His prolific work extends to numerous Practice Guideline reviews in the Journal of American Family Physician.

A graduate of Des Moines University-College of Osteopathic Medicine, he completed a Family Medicine Residency at St. Petersburg General Hospital.

### **Jeffrey Cashman, MS, DO, FACOFP\***

Dr. Cashman is Associate Dean for Pre-Clinical Medical Education at Edward Via College of Osteopathic Medicine -Carolinas. He serves as a preceptor at Spartanburg Regional Family Medicine Residency and is team physician for Spartanburg High School.

Dr. Cashman serves as the Speaker of the House of Delegates for the South Carolina Medical Association, was the first Osteopathic President of the Spartanburg County Medical Society, and previously chaired the SCMA Bioethics Committee and SC Ethics Pandemic Task Force. He is the Leadership Director for VCOM-Carolinas' HRSA funded Primary Care Champions Fellowship and was named to the SC Rural Physician Board. Dr. Cashman is a Physician Member of the South Carolina Osteopathic Medical Society.

A graduate of Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine-Georgia Campus. Dr. Cashman completed a Family Medicine Residency at AnMed Health Family in Anderson, SC, and a fellowship with the Costin Institute for Osteopathic Medical Educators at Midwestern University.

### **Michael Centilli, DO, FAAD, FAOCD**

Dr. Centilli, a Board-Certified dermatologist and Mohs Surgeon, is the Clinical Director and Owner at Coastal Dermatology Institute in Myrtle Beach, SC.

He treats all conditions associated with the skin, hair, and nails, with a specific interest in the diagnosis and treatment of skin cancer. He has devoted many years building expertise in Mohs surgery and skin cancer treatment, performing on average 1,500 Mohs surgery cases each year. He provides cutting-edge care for general and cosmetic dermatology and is proficient in the injection of Botox and fillers used to soften the effects of aging.

A graduate of Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine, Dr. Centilli completed residency training at Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills, MI, where he served as chief resident.

### **Jennifer N. Clements, PharmD, FCCP, FADCES, BCPS, CDCES, BCACP, BC-ADM**

Ms. Clements is a Board-Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialist, Board-Certified Ambulatory Care Pharmacist, Certified Diabetes Care and Education Specialist, and Board-Certified in Advanced Diabetes Management. She is Clinical Professor and Director of Pharmacy Education at University of South Carolina College of Pharmacy at the School of Medicine - Greenville Campus. ## **Clancy Crowley, CFP, CPWA**

He is the founding President of the Palmetto Association of Toxicologists, is a certified WMD HAZMAT technician, and is a former member of the SLED Forensics Weapons of Mass Destruction Response Team and the South Carolina Bioterrorism Advisory Committee.

## **Kandi Fredere, MHA, PhD, FACHE, MCHES**

Ms. Fredere serves as Region Health Director with the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control Upstate Public Health Region where she is responsible for public health services and systems coordination in 11 counties across the Upstate. She also serves as adjunct professor in the Human Services program at Anderson University and is a clinical practice mentor for MPH students at USC's Arnold School of Public Health.

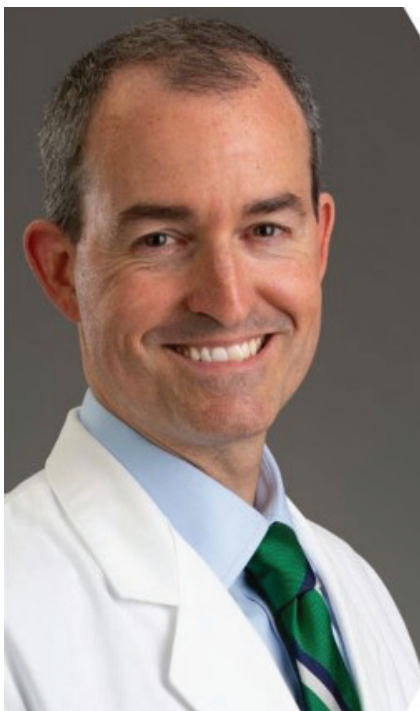
